



The Rector writes

It's a long time since we had a Pope who was less than 70 years old. In fact, it was before May 1990, when Pope John Paul II celebrated his 70th birthday. We do currently have a Pope aged less than 70, but that will no longer be the case next **Sunday, 14 September, when Pope Leo XIV will celebrate his 70th birthday.** We pray for him and we commend him and his universal apostolic ministry to the intercession of Saint Leo and Saint Peter.

Next Sunday will be the feast of the **Exaltation of the Holy Cross,** and as it is a feast of the Lord, it takes precedence over a Sunday in Ordinary Time. So next Sunday, the liturgy will be that of the feast. The liturgical colour will be red, and the readings and prayers will be those, not of the Sunday, but of the feast. What a fitting day for the birthday of our Holy Father, whose principal task is to proclaim the Cross and Resurrection of the Lord Jesus to all the world!

Meanwhile, this Sunday, the **gold medal of the Guild of Saint Stephen** will be awarded to **Andrew Watson** in view of the fifty years he has given to serving at the altar, initially at Saint Monica's, Palmers Green, and latterly at Saint Aloysius, Somers Town, Our Lady of Hal, Camden Town, and here at Saint James's. Andrew gives invaluable service to the church, not only as a server and reader, but also as our sacristan. There is no shortage of work for him! We are most grateful to all our altar servers for the invaluable assistance they provide, though there is always room for more, so please do consider offering yourselves for this service if you think it might be a possibility for you. Saint Stephen is the patron saint of altar servers and of deacons. He appears on the altarpiece in our church, kneeling to the right, behind the shepherds, carrying a palm and also a stone, the instrument of his martyrdom. Westminster Cathedral, the spiritual home of the Guild of Saint Stephen, has a mosaic of him above the sanctuary. This parish has a long-standing affiliation to the Guild, so it seems most fitting to be renewing our links with the Guild on this occasion.

We have been asked to draw your attention to a talk to be given at **Saint Mary's**, **Hampstead**, at 4pm on **Sunday 21 September**, by Lady Oxford, a renowned Shakespeare scholar, entitled "*Shakespeare's Shadowplay?*" Clare Asquith, Countess of Oxford and Asquith, argues that Shakespeare used coded language, adopting the language of the Catholic underground, particularly the Jesuits during the Reformation in England, partly as an appeal to the monarchy for tolerance. Attendance is free of charge, but you are asked to book a place if you wish to attend, by e-mailing the Parish Administrator at hampstead@rcdow.org.uk. It will also be possible to view a streamed version of the lecture at https://www.churchservices.tv/hampstead

We are currently advertising for two cleaners to work here at Saint James's and in the adjoining spaces. There are only a few days remaining before the deadline for submitting applications, so do please put in an application soon if you are interested in the position.

As expected, the demand for **certificates of Catholic practice** has already begun. Do please remember that the parish priest can only sign such a form if he knows that the parents practise their faith regularly. In the event that the request arrives from parents unknown to the parish priest, he will need to ask for evidence that they have attended Mass for three consecutive Sundays. Be prepared to obtain this by approaching the priest celebrant after Sunday Mass and obtaining his signature, either on a form that he may have on his person, or else on your parish newsletter.

Forms are also available now, at the back of the church and on the parish website, for those wishing to enrol in the parish's sacramental programmes, that is to say, **First Holy Communion**, aimed at children in Year 3 at school, **Confirmation**, aimed at young people in Year 9 at school, and the **RCIA**, aimed at adults wishing to know more about the Catholic faith. If you wish to enrol for one of these courses, please submit the relevant form to the parish office, duly completed, by the first weekend in October.

Monday of this week is the feast of the **Nativity of the Blessed Virgin Mary.** Only three birthdays are celebrated in the liturgical year, namely those of Our Lord, Our Lady and Saint John the Baptist, all of whom were intimately involved in God's plan for the salvation of the world, and all three of whom were born in remarkable circumstances. Mary's mother, Saint Anne, is a secondary patron of our church, which is why it seems particularly fitting that we have a statue of Saint Anne close to the entrance to the Lady Chapel. The statue actually represents three figures - Saint Anne herself, holding her daughter Mary, who in turn is holding her son Jesus. Representations of the birth of Our Lady, such as the famous triptych in the National Gallery, evidently give a prominent place to Saint Anne.

The feast of Our Lady's birth is also kept by our friends in the Order of Malta as the feast of Our Lady of Philermo. They are praying a novena to her during these days, asking that she "who was comfort and strength to the Knights through their trials may stand by us whenever we are besieged by temptation, fear and doubt." We do well to make that same petition.
