

The Rector writes

This weekend, sadly, we say goodbye to **Father John Njorteah**, but in his place we welcome **Father Domenico Lando** who greets the parishioners warmly:

"Dear friends of Saint James's, Spanish Place,

It is a true joy to join you as your new assistant priest. From the moment I arrived, I have felt the warmth and generosity of this parish, and I am eager to get to know each of you in the weeks and months ahead.

I come from Varapodio, a small town in Calabria, Italy. Music has always been at the heart of my life — not only as a passion, but as a way of connecting with God and others. I am trained in flute and voice, and I have studied composition and choir direction, experiences that have allowed me to guide parish and diocesan choirs, accompany liturgies, and help communities pray through music.

I was spiritually formed with the Jesuits in Posillipo, deepening my understanding of Ignatian spirituality, which continues to guide my life and ministry. Academically, I hold a bachelor's degree in Linguistic Mediation, as well as master's degrees in Philosophy and in Modern Languages and Literature. These studies have enriched my personal and priestly journey, helping me to understand, communicate, and engage with people from diverse cultures and backgrounds.

Becoming a priest has been a transformative journey of faith. Serving in different parishes has allowed me to accompany people in their joys, struggles, and everyday challenges. I have always sought to meet people where they are, sharing God's love in both small daily gestures and significant moments in life.

Music, however, is more than a skill or profession; it is a form of prayer. I hope to share this gift with the parish, not only through choirs and liturgies but also by encouraging everyone — young and old — to experience the beauty and joy that sacred music can bring to our worship and to our hearts.

I would also like to offer my heartfelt thanks to Fr. John Njorteah, who has served this community with great dedication and love. His ministry here has been a true blessing, and we are grateful for all he has contributed to Saint James's. I pray that God abundantly blesses him as he returns to Nigeria, guiding his studies and pastoral mission, and filling his heart with joy and peace.

Beyond music, my prayer and ministry are always oriented toward building community, friendship, and spiritual growth. I look forward to celebrating the sacraments with you, accompanying families, youth, and individuals, and walking together in faith. Every parish is a family, and I hope to listen, learn, and grow with all of you, sharing in your joys and supporting you in your challenges.

I am deeply grateful to Monsignor Philip and the parish staff for their warm welcome and support. Please know that I hold all of you in my prayers, and I ask for yours in return. May God bless Saint James's, fill your hearts with His love, and guide us as we journey together in faith."

I am confident that the parishioners will make Father Domenico very welcome, and that soon it will be hard to remember that there was ever a time when he wasn't with us.

Monday of the coming week is the **feast of the Presentation of the Lord**, when we recall the moment, recounted in Saint Luke's Gospel, when Mary and Joseph brought the child Jesus to the Temple. With reference to the theme "*lumen ad revelationem gentium*" - a light to enlighten the Gentiles, that appears in Simeon's famous canticle, the "*Nunc Dimittis*", we celebrate this day as a feast of light, bearing blessed candles in procession, since the point of this feast is that the Light of the World was made manifest to all when Jesus was presented in the Temple. Mass will be celebrated at the usual weekday times.

Because this feast comes forty days after the birth of Jesus, it was the moment when according to Jewish law, the mother of a male child could offer a purification sacrifice and come once more into the sanctuary. For this reason, it was once kept as a feast of Our Lady, and in the Liber Usualis instructions are given that a new Marian antiphon, the *Ave Regina Cælorum*, be sung from Compline on this feast until Wednesday of Holy Week. Although the current liturgical books give no instructions regarding the choice of Marian antiphon, it is customary to follow the rhythm of the pre-Conciliar liturgy, insofar as it can be adapted to the modern calendar, so at our 10.30am Sunday Mass we will be singing the *Ave Regina Cælorum* from now until Easter.

Friday of this week being the **first Friday of the month**, we hope to expose the Blessed Sacrament from the end of the lunchtime Mass until shortly before 5pm, when a wedding rehearsal is scheduled to take place. We will only be able to do so, however, if a sufficient number of worshippers sign slots on the timed sheet at the back of the church, committing themselves to be present, as it would not be appropriate to leave the exposed Sacrament unattended. Worship of the Blessed Sacrament is heartily recommended to the faithful, as "*in his presence [they] pour out their hearts for themselves and for those dear to them; they pray for peace and for the salvation of the world.*"

This month of February will see a formal **farewell to Cardinal Vincent Nichols** at the **5.30pm Mass in Westminster Cathedral on Thursday 5 February**, the annual **Mass for the Sick in the cathedral at 2pm on Saturday 7 February** (*a ticketed event*), the **installation of our new Archbishop Richard Moth on Saturday 14 February** (*another ticketed event*), the **start of Lent on Wednesday 18 February** and the **Rite of Election on Saturday 21 February**. In our daily prayers, we remember all those involved in these momentous events.
